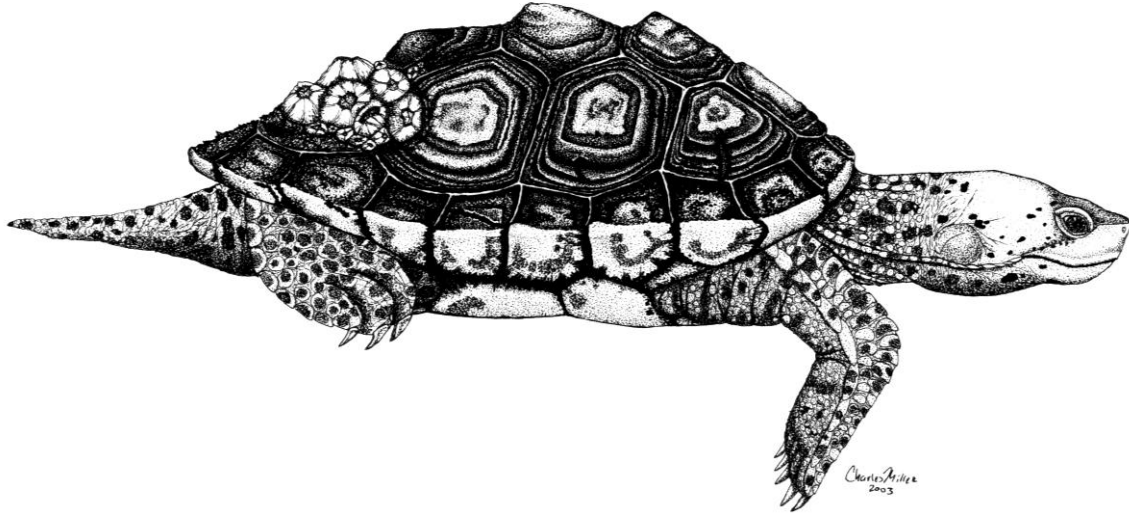


**Management and Conservation of Diamondback Terrapins
